
Education is a foundation for life and a gateway for personal, social, and economic development. However, according to the <u>UNESCO Institute for Statistics</u>, 2022, more than 250 million children and youth worldwide are not in school, and among those in school, many fail to reach minimum proficiency levels in reading and mathematics due to a poor learning environment. Cordaid contributes to the improvement of primary school education through Performance-Based Financing.

# **WHAT IS PBF?**

Performance-Based Financing (PBF) is a systemstrengthening approach that aims to improve the:

- Equitable access to education
- Quality of education
- Governance of schools and the education sector

The essence of PBF is a direct link between funding and verified results: contrary to traditional input financing, payments to contracted primary schools are only made after their outputs are verified.

PBF is more than a change in the way schools and education governance actors are financed: it is an education system reform strategy that introduces checks and balances, motivates staff, promotes entrepreneurship, and involves governmental departments and agencies, as well as parents, pupils and community representatives. PBF has six elements:



Link payments to results measured by indicators



Separation of functions: regulator, provider, verifier, purchaser, financer



Contract and submit the management improvement plan for verification



Community
empowerment:
feedback and
customer satisfaction:
beneficiaries voice



Autonomy in terms of money use, hiring and firing staff



Equity measures



## **RESULTS OF PBF IN EDUCATION**


The Cordaid PBF primary education programme has the following scope:

- DRC: 14 provinces: 1350 schools, 630,000 children
- Burundi: Muramvya, 125 schools, 110,126 children
- Ethiopia: Shabee district: 54 schools 36,010 children
- Uganda: Kamuli district: 50 schools 31,750 children

Cordaid is exploring the development of new projects in Mali and Burkina Faso.

Trimester 3-23: No verifications done because of school holidays.







### **Examples of PBF results in DRC**

Between 2018 and 2021, as part of the PAQUE project with funding from the Global Partnership for Education, managed by the World Bank, Cordaid provided technical assistance to all levels of the Democratic Republic of Congo's (DRC) education system, supporting the Ministry of Primary, Secondary and Technical Education (MEPST) through PBF in primary education. Some examples of the results achieved are shown in the graphs below:



During the 3rd term of 2019-2020, schools were closed due to Covid-19 so no verification of pupil attendance could be done.
